Dear Mr. Meacham:

I wish to thank you very kindly for your recent information which you passed on to us about the accreditation status of California State Polytechnic College. We are very happy indeed to hear this and know that you in the administrative forces of the school are very pleased over your success at being accredited. As you know under the provisions of the National Interfraternity Conference, member fraternities are not permitted to have chapters on campuses where the school is not accredited. Of course, the sources we have for this information did not show your status and that was the reason I had to write Mr. Dawe advising them that we were not aware of this status on your part. Your letter shows that we were not aware of this status on your part.

I see that you have not given full administrative approval for the presence of fraternities on campus. I am just wondering what particular procedure, if any, you will have to require formal application for entrance onto your campus. Whatever it may be, we will be very happy to comply. It is our policy to cooperate with the college administration locally and nationally on all affairs relative to the welfare of the chapter and fraternity. As you may know, we have chapters established at the following schools in California: University of California (Los Angeles, Berkeley, and Santa Barbara), Fresno State College, San Jose State College, San Diego State College and the University of Southern California. Also, we have chapters in New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Oregon and Washington. Our plans call for activity in the states of Utah, Wyoming, Montana and Idaho which will give us good representation throughout the entire district.

We would welcome your investigation of us at any of the schools where we are located. If there is any information of any type or nature that you desire to have from us, we will be only too happy to see that it is granted you. Perhaps one of these days shortly, one of our national representatives residing in Los Angeles, will call on you personally to discuss further the affiliation of a group of men on your campus with Delta Sigma Phi.
